# New and refurbished apartments for Thorn Close, Wednesbury

Work is underway on Thorn Close in Wednesbury, on the refurbishment of 28 apartments and the construction of four new apartments.

We are providing architecture and landscape architecture services, quantity surveying and structural engineering support to the project.

As well as creating four new affordable homes for Sandwell, the work is transforming the existing buildings. The external walls of the blocks will receive insulated, full-height rainscreen cladding – improving the look of the buildings while boosting energy efficiency and helping to lower tenants' fuel bills.

The buildings will also benefit from new entrance porches, a new pitched roof,

replacement windows and external doors, and improvements to balconies. Inside, there will be improvements to communal areas and staircases.

Outside, the area around the buildings will be modernised to provide muchneeded car parking spaces and a more aesthetically pleasing environment. Hard and soft landscaping works will include planting, and the addition of cycle and bin stores.

Sandwell Council's Neighbourhood Services department is our client and SWG Construction Build & Renovate is the main contractor.

#### Mechanical and electrical engineering work in schools

During school holidays, when stairways are silent, corridors are clean, canteens are quiet, and whiteboards are wiped ... we are hard at work!

School holidays are some of the busiest times for our mechanical and electrical engineering team, as they take the opportunity to maintain, refurbish or replace schools' heating systems while staff and students have a break.

We prioritise work according to the age and condition of existing systems, assessing the effects of a possible failure. Our overall aim is to give Sandwell's schools resilience against nuisance breakdowns and to reduce the likelihood

of school closures during term time.

Where existing boilers are oil-fired, we upgrade them to gas. Technology has advanced in recent years, so gas-fired boilers are more efficient. Their impact on the environment has reduced and they are more economical to run.

We work closely with colleagues in Sandwell Council's Energy Team in our mutual goal to reduce emissions. We design replacement works with this in mind.

### Twenty new homes on Church Hill Street, Smethwick

On Church Hill Street in Smethwick, we worked with building contractor Harper Construction to develop twenty new homes. These comprise fifteen traditionally built houses and five bungalows, all for affordable rent. Two of the properties are fully wheelchair compliant.

UDBS had a significant role in bringing the homes to completion, with our architects, landscape architects, quantity surveyors and structural engineers all involved in the project.

Our design approach included

incorporating a mix of red and grey bricks, along with stone-effect windowsills and heads, in keeping with the character of properties in nearby Vicarage Road.

The Housing Partnerships Team at Sandwell Council was our client and the development was funded through government Retained Right to Buy receipts.

These two- and four-bedroom homes are now fully occupied.

# Urban Bike Park







### The opening of Sandwell Urban Bike Park

We are delighted to have had an instrumental role in the delivery of a new bike park for Sandwell.

Close to the Swan Pool area of Sandwell Valley, the Sandwell Urban Bike Park incorporates facilities for young people and families with children, as well as challenging downhill trails for seasoned mountain bikers.

Our client was the Sport and Leisure Team at Sandwell Council, who appointed us to support the park's construction. UDBS' services included procuring specialist consultants, tender, procurement and contract management, on-site supervision, CDM management, quality control, and payments.

Back on Track Mountain Bike Solutions Ltd was the main contractor. Sport England funded the majority of the project through the Places to Ride programme, with Birmingham City Council and Sandwell Council providing the rest.

"The Bike Park is now open to the public and has been exceptionally well received by cyclists of all abilities. The facility is enabling Sandwell residents to get active and exercise through the sport of cycling. The facility is attracting cyclists from across the region who are keen to enjoy a high-class resource" –

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# Heating systems

## Heating system upgrades in high-profile buildings

Like the work we do in schools (see page 4), many of our projects are quiet and unseen – but they benefit people every day.

In 2023 UDBS's mechanical and electrical engineering team oversaw the planned replacement of inefficient gas-fired boilers and the associated heating plant at Highfields House (Sandwell Register Office).

We carried out similar upgrades at the Frank Chapman Outdoor Centre in Bewdley, Worcestershire.

In both cases, we removed existing oilfired boilers and associated heating plants and replaced them with gasfired, efficient modulating condensing boilers. This means the buildings no longer use fuel oil, and are already benefiting from reduced heating costs and emissions. New optimiser/ compensation controllers sense changes in outside temperature, further enhancing the buildings' energy efficiency and boosting comfort levels indoors. Dodd Group Ltd was our contractor for both projects, under a direct access framework arrangement with Sandwell Council.

"The benefits are not only financial with the conversion from oil to gas, but environmentally and aesthetically pleasing. We have found the heating is on for considerably less time, due to instantaneous heat and hot water. And we never run out of hot water! Which is a blessing when there are 40 young people all requiring a shower within the same hour" - Debbie Heritage, Frank Chapman Outdoor Education Centre.

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
### **Richard Nugent Centre**







#### The opening of the Richard Nugent Centre, Wednesbury



A new health centre has opened in Wednesbury – and we are proud to have project-managed its development.

The Richard Nugent Centre has been built on a brownfield site next to Wednesbury Leisure Centre. Spacious and light-filled, the building is significantly larger than the healthcare facilities it replaces. It includes a suite of consulting, treatment and meeting rooms, plus 32 on-site car parking spaces and an ambulance drop-off area.

Interclass was our construction contractor, having been awarded the work through the Constructing West Midlands framework. Sandwell Council fully financed and delivered the health centre on behalf of the NHS, which is now leasing the building from the council.

The Richard Nugent Centre forms part of a wider project in Wednesbury, including the construction of five new affordable homes on King Street. UDBS' input for the houses included conducting feasibility studies, design, procurement, delivery and contract administration.
